Citrus Counseling Services uses Kaiser Foundation Hospital, Fontana grant to Increase Access to Services

Citrus Counseling Services (CCS) recently received a \$24,500 grant from the Kaiser Foundation Hospital, Fontana to establish a new licensed mental health therapist in the Inland Empire. The CCS Board praised the Kaiser Foundation's dedication to increasing behavioral health service capacity.

Redlands, CA December 7, 2021- Roger Uminski II, CEO, at CCS announced to his board that the Kaiser Foundation Hospital, Fontana awarded a behavioral health service capacity grant to CCS. These funds will be used to cover the salary for a licensed mental health therapist new to the Inland Empire while they go through the insurance credentialing process.

Until a therapist has been credentialed, CCS cannot bill an insurance company for the services they provide. This limits them to serve people who can pay out of pocket or qualify for special services funded by state and county programs. This grant will allow CCS to provide about 160 hours of services to about sixteen individuals during the 3-6 month credentialing process. More importantly, a desperately needed mental health therapist will serve our community going forward. CCS is contracted to provide mental health services to Kaiser Members.

The 2019 Kaiser Community Health Needs Assessment for the San Bernardino County Area reports that poor mental health is higher in this service area than the state of California and the southern California region. The California Healthcare Foundation 2018 report on physician supply in California documents that the Inland Empire is woefully underserved. There are 34.5 primary care physicians and 64.3 specialty care physicians per 100,000 residents. Orange County's ratio is 52 primary care/108.4 specialty clinicians per 100,000 residents. California's overall is 49.8/104.1. Specialty care includes mental health. CCS is a practicum site for Master's Level students from Loma Linda University, Cal Baptist University, University of Redlands,

Cal State San Bernardino, Azusa Pacific University, and others. We do this to support a pipeline to create more mental health therapists for this region. After a student earns their degree, they must practice as an Associate Therapist under a licensed therapist's supervision for two years and pass an exam to become licensed. It then takes 6-9 months for them to complete the insurance company panel processes to see patients with insurance.
